SUBJECT: SITUATION REPORT ON WINTER WEATHER #2

OVERVIEW – Winter Storm Warnings and Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for much of central and southern Wisconsin through Tuesday night. Freezing rain and sleet began earlier this afternoon and has been turning into snow. Current snowfall amounts are:

- LaCrosse – 2 – 2 ½ inches
- Madison – 2 inches
- Green Bay 1.7 inches
- Milwaukee – less than an inch

Snow will continue to fall throughout the evening and tomorrow bringing anywhere from 6 to 12 inches of snow.

WI State Patrol – State Patrol is reporting three weather related crashes – one in Racine County and two in Sauk County. In Sauk County, there was a semi-rollover incident with minor injuries along mile marker 92. There have also been reports of run-offs in various areas. No reports of fatalities.

The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was activated at 3 p.m. to monitor the storm. Representatives from Wisconsin Emergency Management, Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Wisconsin State Patrol, Wisconsin National Guard, and the National Weather Service/NOAA are staffing the EOC.

Wisconsin DOT - As of 6:00 PM today, Monday December 8, until sunrise Thursday, December 11, all oversize and overweight permit operations under either single or multiple trip permits IS SUSPENDED within the geographical area on and south of highways I-94, Wis 29, Wis 22, and all roadways in Door County.
