A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, extreme heat and humidity create emergencies of great concern due to the potential threat of life to the citizens of the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, summer heat waves are the biggest weather-related killers in Wisconsin for the past 50 years, far exceeding tornado and other storm-related deaths; and

WHEREAS, in 1995, two major killer heat waves affected most of Wisconsin resulting in 154 heat-related deaths and over 300 heat-related illnesses; and

WHEREAS, there were four heat-related deaths reported in 2006 during shorter heat waves that occurred in southern Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the State of Wisconsin can be seriously affected by severe heat, and it is essential that we increase awareness of the dangers of heat waves and the protective actions which can be taken by citizens;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim June 11, 2009 as
